**FINDINGS OF PROBABLE CAUSE AND REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATION**

---

**THIS DAY** this cause came on to be heard by the Madison County, Mississippi, Grand Jury, having been duly elected, impaneled, sworn and charged in and for the jurisdiction aforesaid at the JUNE 2017 Term of Circuit Court, and having been recalled into session at 9:00 a.m. on November 29, 2017; and, the said Madison County Grand Jurors, after having considered the sworn testimony of witnesses called to testify in this matter and all of the proceedings had and done herein, finds probable cause does not exist to return an indictment for Capital Murder, but does find that there exists probable cause to believe that the above named defendant did commit the offenses of: accessory after the fact of murder; accessory after the fact to kidnapping; and, accessory after the fact to automobile theft of a vehicle having a value of more than \$1000.00 but less than \$5,000.00. Furthermore, the Grand Jury finds that at the time of these offenses the Defendant was seventeen (17) years and nine (9) months old, and therefore had not yet reached his eighteenth (18<sup>th</sup>) birthday and was not under the original jurisdiction of the Circuit Court.

**THEREFORE, THE GRAND JURY**, pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. §43-21-151 (1972, as amended), finds that exclusive original jurisdiction for the above listed offenses rests with the Youth Court of Madison County. The Grand Jury hereby respectfully requests that the Youth Court of Madison County take all available actions to certify the above named individual as an adult and thereby transfer this case to the Circuit Court of Madison County. The Grand Jury believes it to be in the best interest of justice that said Defendant be charged and tried as an adult for his involvement in the death of Kingston Frazier.
